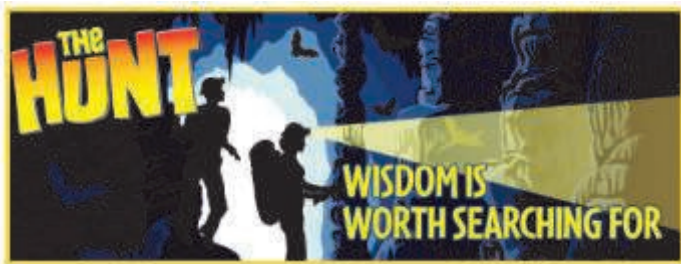

WHAT MAKES A BEACH BAPTISM DIFFERENT?

There are many ways of being baptized, sprinkling water, pouring, submersion... Baptism is not about what we do, but about what God does and all forms of baptism include the same measure of God's grace. So why are we baptizing on the beach? By joining together and being baptized at the beach we are taking our faith public! We want everyone to know about our God and our commitment to Jesus!

HOW DOES BAPTISM AT THE BEACH WORK?

Being baptized at the beach involves being submerged fully under the water with the support of the pastors and their helpers.

CAN I BE RE-BAPTIZED IF I'VE BEEN BAPTIZED BEFORE?

In the United Methodist Church, we only baptize one time because we don't believe that God needs a "redo." However, if you would like to recommit yourself, we invite you to be submerged and remember your baptism with us on the beach.

I DON'T WANT TO BE BAPTIZED, CAN I STILL BE PART OF THE EVENT?

Yes! This to be a church-wide celebration! We invite you to be part of the celebration and join us for a meal and worship on the beach.

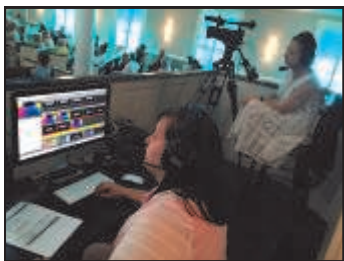
Painters Needed at Carpenter's Shop

JUMPSTART MENTORING FOR SUCCESS

Jumpstart is our middle school mentoring ministry for the students of Largo Middle School. As the new school year begins we will need volunteers to fill the following roles:
