



For those who don't want to sew, we are also looking for volunteers to pin, iron, sort and bag. Come join us for three hours of fellowship and make a difference in a sick child's recovery! 


First Priority Training at St. Paul

First Priority is an organization blazing the trail for students to share their love for Jesus at their schools and teaching them how to share their story with non-believers. Students have the right to start a Christian club at their school, and First Priority helps by sending them a church-approved youth worker to coach them on how to reach their campus for Christ.
