
WEAR THE SHIRT





Update from Carolyn Goodwin

My New Year's resolution was to go "slowly-slowly." This resolution was made due to the fact I was recovering from pneumonia and couldn't do anything else. As I recovered and gained my strength back it's funny how things kept creeping back into my daily "to do's" slowly slowly. I believe that a lot of good things are being done here in order to advance the Kingdom (with your help). But I confess God is doing good things in me as well. While I haven't been able to do things as slowly as I would like, He has reminded me of Jesus' words in Matthew 11: 29-30: "Take my yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." You don't have to take on

any more than what the Lord wants you to do. This is the freedom Jesus gives us with His "easy yoke and light burdens." We don't need to please anyone but Him.

Trauma Healing workshops are going well, and touching many souls with the good news and hope of Jesus Christ. I'm working with another group, Across, to start a pilot program for children. We will train this group with techniques to get children to be open about their feelings, and the ability to put their past behind them and move forward. Ultimately, showing them they need to trust Jesus for His healing and their life. Once this pilot is established it can be rolled out to other churches and hopefully led by church leaders.

The Grace Home children are doing well. They are getting older and experience the same issues as our children in

America do. During Trauma Healing sessions I'm asked what to do with these older, rebellious children. I have to laugh and tell them if I had an answer I would be rich and famous. The only answer is to not be afraid of them, love and listen to them with all your heart. It's not easy.

My aim is to help develop people I come in contact with and not just give a handout. Money that you send helps in several different ways (and hopefully more for development). It takes care of a crisis (usually medically or health needs) that needs immediate attention; it supports children with school fees for education in Uganda and South Sudan; it provides assistance and education to new mothers and babies left alone in refuge camps; it also supports getting out the Good News of Jesus Christ through trauma healing in the refugee camps, speaking at the prisons, and in schools; it provides Bibles to refugees in the camps, prisons, and those scattered in the Arua area. These are just a few of the things cast by her family and comyou are participating in. Thank you! It sounds like a lot but His yoke is easy and is burden is light. I thank God for you and pray His favor on each of you. I will be home at the end of June and look forward to seeing you then.
