



an opportunity to be part of the

Mexican National Basketball Team, she immigrated to the US on a basketball scholarship at the University of Charleston. She spent some time living on the streets, but when she entered and won a Fresh Salsa competition her life changed. Started with the \$800 given to her at the competition, Maggie's All Natural Fresh Salsa's & Dips, grew into a multi-million dollar business. In 2015, she sold her business to Campbell's. Soon after, she went back to Mexico and helped save 31 orphaned children who were on the verge of falling into drug cartel hands. Magie became a professional speaker to help inspire others to live better, more fulfilling lives. What a blessing to hear Magie's story and be inspired to keeping working toward our life goals no matter the difficulties we encounter.




Congratulations, Graduates!
