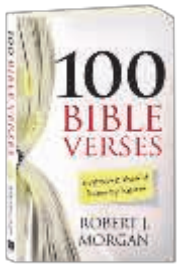

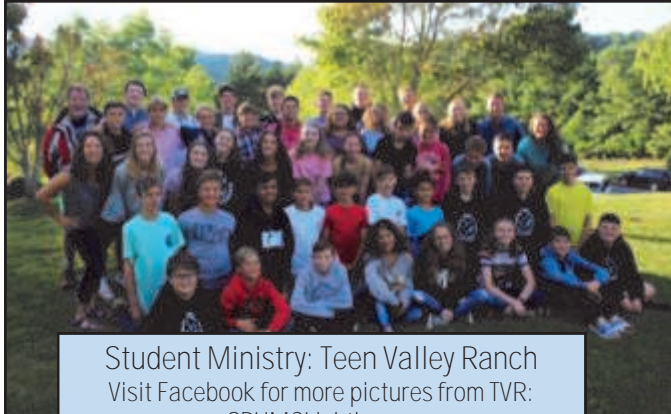
Basketball Camp Was a Success!

Week two of camp was a blast! We had a carnival, a PJ party (pictured above), and our basketball camp!

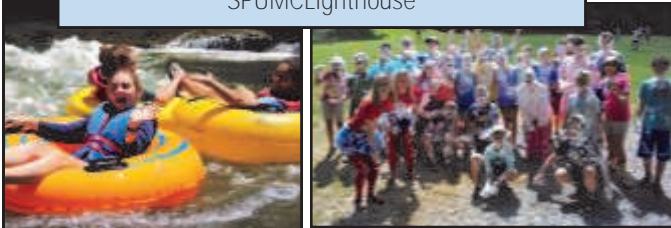
