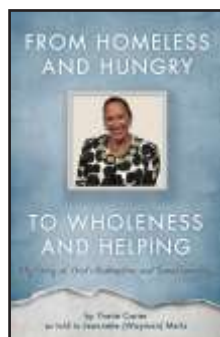

Donate Your Used Christmas Cards

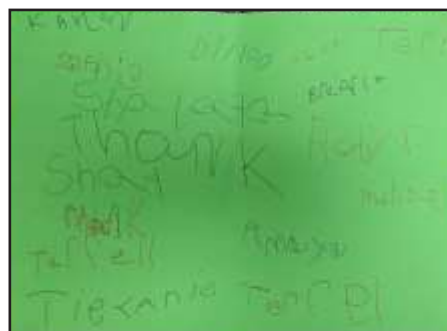

Connection Center Hosts

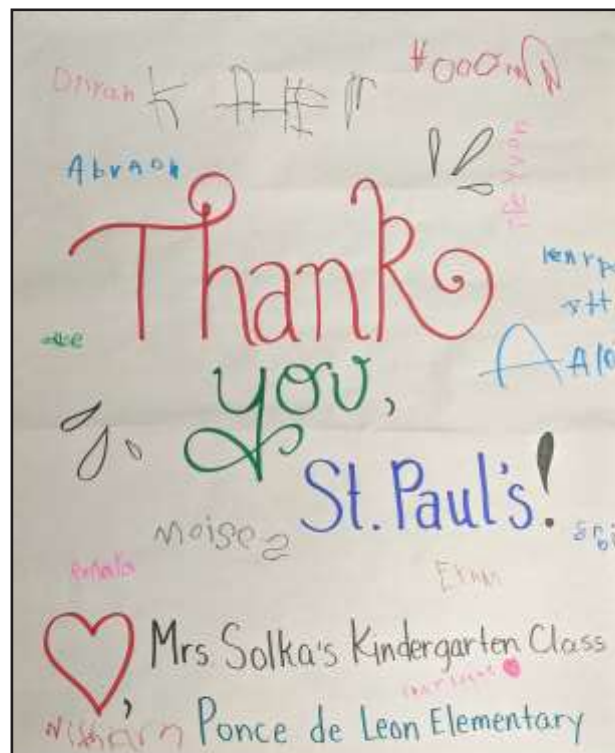

Carolyn Goodwin Update

Well, there is never a dull moment and idleness does not exist here. Let me give a few updates on how God is showing Himself visible in Arua, Uganda through your love, dedication, prayer and finances.

Some people confuse my work as being done by an NGO (non-governmental organization) because we have done so much. I tell them, **"No, there is no NGO with deep pockets here. What I'm able to do comes from the followers of Jesus at home – just like you - who want to share what they have been given, and are answering His call to help those in need."** An example of this is **Football for Jesus**. Several big NGOs like Save the Children, or large religious groups have come into the camp and donated maybe two soccer balls to a camp with hundreds of thousands of people. We came in and organized 36 teams among 3 camps and provided 2 balls per team, uniforms, ref uniforms, cards, whistles, and championship cups between each camp. You helped do this! The Jesus in you! He can do and does wonderful and amazing things! Trauma Healing workshops have been ongoing for the teams and will finish in Imvepi this week. MANY of the players, coaches, and refs have asked Jesus to come into their hearts to be their Lord and Savior. It is our hope funding will allow these clubs to continue for another season.



Trauma Workshop Training Graduates

The children at the prison have grown in number, unfortunately. There are over 80 children now. When I first started visiting over 2 ½ years ago it was around 60. I believe it has increased because of the refugees. About 20-25% of the children come from the refugee camps at any given time. We did a Christmas program, reading the Christmas story, and you gave them a couple of soccer balls, some sweets, and avocados so they had a happy Christmas.

The Trauma Healing Sunday school program continues to

grow! Since the last newsletter, 12 more churches have completed the Trauma Healing lessons and received children's Bibles. **They will go on to train sister churches and become Trauma Healing Churches.** There are another 14 churches that will finish in January. These Bibles and training materials are all because of you! We are obeying Jesus by bringing the children to Him.

There are so many other ways you have reached out to the refugees and Arua community, but I need to take this time **to update you on our UMC children's home, GRACE Home.** The government has told us that we can no longer operate as a home here in Uganda. Bottom line, over 572 orphanages have been closed because of a law which was instituted to prevent trafficking and fire hazards. Sometimes the law takes precedence over common sense and truth. Our GRACE Home children don't understand why they are being ripped away from the only family they have known for 6 years, but we have to follow the law. The silver lining is the children will be able to go to boarding school from Feb. through Nov. The primary kids (26) have all been accepted to a #1 rated school which is located not far from us in Arua. The other 9 children will be going to secondary school.

Where the children will go when not at school is still to be determined. We were faced with the children being sent to guardians, who were unprepared and mostly unwilling to **accept the children. If we didn't let them go, the police were there to take them away.** God intervened and at the eleventh hour we were given an extension of 3 months. At least the children were able to be together for this Christmas and will be able to leave for school from GRACE Home. What a blessing! Now we have to put a plan in place for the future. People have asked what they can do regarding materials, supplies, etc. The best way you can help is with funding. It takes money to pay school fees, and take care of all the other needs including medical, food, and clothing. The items can be gotten here, and are more practical than things that can be sent from home. Buying local also helps support the community here, and is more cost effective. You can make financial donations at tms-global.org/give. My number is 3080. If you would like to mark your donation specifically for GRACE Home, Trauma Workshops, Soccer, etc. you can include a note when you give.
