During each Sunday of the Advent season, we focus on one of the four virtues Jesus brings us as we light the four candles of Advent. At St. Paul we use three blue candles, and one pink candle to represent joy, along with one larger, white candle as the Christ candle. The lighting of the first candle symbolizes hope and expectation, while the second symbolizes peace, the third joy and the fourth love. The white Christ candle is lit on Christmas Eve reminding Christians that Jesus is the light of the world.

Should a Child Attend Preschool?

In today's world with ABC Mouse, PBS Kids and Leap Frog, it is very easy for a child to learn his or her ABC's and 123's at home. If a mom or a dad has the ability to stay at home with a preschooler, then why should a child attend preschool? Aside from giving mom or dad some free time for themselves, a preschool setting helps a child develop emotionally and socially. Preschool is a child's first exposure to a structured setting with other children. This setting will allow the child to learn to share and follow directions. The structured setting also helps the child learn to feel secure and cared for while away from home. Through play activities, a child strengthens his or her pre-math and pre-literary skills. Developing these skills to their fullest is important since kindergarten is becoming more academic. Also, working on prekindergarten skills helps a child learn to help others. Helping your fellow preschooler make a "set of five" gives the helper a sense of competence and self-worth. While attending preschool from the age of two years old may not be for every family, I would encourage all parents to consider attending a preschool the year prior to starting kindergarten. Doing so can give the child an edge on that first big day at kindergarten.
