



Yvette Carter Shares Her Inspiring Story






Worship Arts on Wednesdays

- Schedule practices.
- Become certified in bowling and track and field in order to take the athletes to State Games. Certification is good for 3 years.
- Attend a coaches meeting once a year in August.

Update from Missionary Carolyn Goodwin Praise God! Baruch HaShem! I made it back to Uganda safely and was able to hit the ground running continuing our work for the Lord here. Sunday school in Bidibidi, Imvepi, and Rhino Camp kicked off with a very good training in Arua. From there we met with the trainers and the Sunday School teachers and pastors from each church and shared baskets of teaching materials. I have heard very good things about the classes. Kids are excited to come, in fact they are there waiting for the teachers to show up!



More "mommie kits" have been distributed to new parents "to-be" and underprivileged new mothers. This ministry has grown into a close community of young people that have been encouraged

with Christ centered classes in baby and child care, and marriage counseling. Some of the young women are working together to start their own tailoring business. God is so good!

The prison ministry is going very well. The inmates like the training so much that one of the inmates who was released asked the warden if they could come back each Friday to finish the training. In a couple of weeks the inmates will have a celebration with certificates for completing the training.



Our football (soccer) league is gearing up and becoming a reality thanks to the Lightner Award, and donations from St. Paul Handicapable for soccer balls, and Dee and Lisa for soccer shirts. We

thank the Lord this ministry can proceed. We are praying for funds to continue next season, and bring in the Omugo camp. Everyone is so excited in the camps for this diversion from the effects of trauma and poverty. It gives them something to look forward to and cheer about. **Each shirt has "Football for Jesus" for a** logo, and each person involved in the program will be encouraged to build their faith in Christ and give Him the glory and honor in every practice and game.

Trauma Healing workshops are ongoing and scheduled weekly for the rest of the year. I really thought the workshops would be phased out with Sunday School, **but they are being requested so much, I can't say** no. However, I do need to find someone to help with the schedule now that the league is getting underway and workshops need to be held for each of the teams and families. This is a good problem to have!



These are just a few highlights of what has been happening since my return in mid-August. I thank God for your love and support through prayers and financing to make all these things possible. And I

thank God for His companionship, strength and good health to continue day by day to do His will. What a blessing to share the word of God. I believe this is the **highest calling in life, and I'm so honored and in awe** to do His work!
