

FAQ about COVID Safety

We have been working hard to ensure that camp will run smoothly and safely. Here are some questions you and your families may have.

What are your health and symptom guidelines?

As we open Camp XP 2021, the CDC has asked that we be cautious with screening symptoms. If you or anyone in your family are experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms we ask that you stay home. Those who have tested positive for COVID-19 or have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive should adhere to the CDC [guidelines](#) for isolation and quarantine.

Will my child have to wear a face mask?

After reviewing recent guidelines from the CDC, we plan on being mask optional at our facility. When on offsite trips and during transportation, we will ask all staff and campers to wear masks. We encourage families to discuss their comfort level and decide whether you would like your child to continue wearing a mask when they are onsite with us. We will support and enforce the decision you choose for your family.

Is the Camp XP team taking any extra cleaning measures in my child's classroom?

Kids' classrooms, restrooms and touch points will be disinfected throughout the day and all kids' locations will be deep cleaned weekly. We have removed certain toys from the classrooms to reduce cross-contamination.

How many kids will my camper be in contact with?

Due to COVID 19 safety measures, spots will be limited. Each group will have set number of kids and counselors and other camp staff will stay with their assigned group to minimize the possibility of exposure. Smaller groups will also help the kids bond and make good friends throughout the summer!

Will there be field trips this summer?

We feel confident that we can safely travel offsite for field trips this summer! We will choose offsite locations carefully, and require masks and social distancing wherever possible while we are off campus. All vehicles used will be sanitized between each use. We will also have FIELD TRIPS COME TO US! We will have special onsite demonstrators, visitors, or fun activities planned at the church. We will continue to monitor and follow CDC recommendations, and to update our policies if needed to keep our staff and campers safe.
